**Assumed:** You cannot know whether God exists, nor can you know what he is. **Question**: Should one believe or not believe in the face of the uncertainty?

**Answer**: It's better to believe because...

	You believe	You don't believe
God Exists	Gain infinite happiness for infinity	Infinite pain

exist	You gain a bit	Neither lose nor gain

If you believe "[y]ou will be faithful, honest, humble, grateful, generous, a sincere friend, truthful. Certainly you will not have those poisonous pleasures, glory and luxury" (84, right column).

**Question:** I see it's best to believe, but how should I do it?

**Answer**: Don't look for proofs of God's existence; train your passions, not your reason.

• Hang out with believers and act as if you believed: take the holy water, have mass, etc.

**Objection**: Believers are always afraid of hell.

Reply: Who should be more afraid: those who don't believe and will certainly face it if there's a God, or

those who do believe and so have hope of avoiding it?
